# **Development & Building Permits**

# DO I NEED TO APPLY FOR A PERMIT? YES!

You must make application BEFORE commencing <u>any</u> development within the municipality (the carrying out of <u>any</u> building, engineering, mining or other operations, in, on, or over land, or the making of any material change in the use of <u>any</u> building or land). This includes <u>agricultural buildings and residential decks or accessory buildings.</u>

Applications can be obtained through the Municipal Office or on the R.M. website at rmofcanwood.ca. The process of permit approval can take a minimum of 2 to 4 weeks. DO NOT begin your project until you have a signed permit from the office.

# **NEW Rural Address Signs**

Your new rural address is located on your tax notice below your residential land description. This is the address to use for emergency services. Signs will be distributed later in the year beginning with Divisions 5 and 6. The office will contact you when the signs are available for you to pick up and install.

## TAX PAYMENT OPTIONS

## 1. ONLINE BANKING

The R.M. of Canwood is set up as a payee with the following institutions: Credit Unions, Scotiabank and TD Canada Trust. We are listed as **Canwood No 494 (RM) Taxes.** When adding The R.M. of Canwood as a payee, you will be asked to add an account number with a minimum of 5 digits. This account number is the number in brackets beside your name on your tax notice as you will see in the example below. If you have fewer than 5 digits, just add zeros.
